Dear Parents and Carers,

As Term 3 draws to a close, we wanted to say a huge thank you for all of your support with home learning over the past six weeks. We fully understand the challenges brought by juggling home learning, wider family commitments and working from home. We certainly hope that the half term week gives everyone an opportunity to rest and enjoy a very well earned break. It has been an absolute pleasure for me as Head of Schools and for other Senior Leaders to spend time in the Google Classrooms and on Tapestry so that we can celebrate all of the wonderful learning going on. We were overwhelmed with the positive responses from our recent survey, so a very big thank you for letting us know your views. Your comments about things that have worked well with online learning have been shared with all teachers and we have also looked carefully at constructive comments in order to evolve our remote education practice. Offering live sessions with class teachers is something that many of you have asked for and is something that we were trialling with some pupils in Year 6. We were thrilled to be able to offer each class two live sessions over the past two weeks and we will be having these daily from Term 4. Please look out for the invitations through Google Classroom and Tapestry shortly. Please also make sure you have returned your remote permission forms to take part in live learning. Our teachers and support staff were absolutely thrilled to be able to see their classes together again!

All staff very much hope that we will be returning on March 8th so that pupils will once again have access to face to face teaching within the classroom. We are expecting an announcement from The Government on February 22nd and will update you as soon as we have further information. Thank you once again for your support and patience during the ongoing pandemic. It has been very much appreciated.

We have also been learning all about what happens to our rubbish and how we can recycle. We have been learning how we can become more eco-friendly and look after the future of our planet.



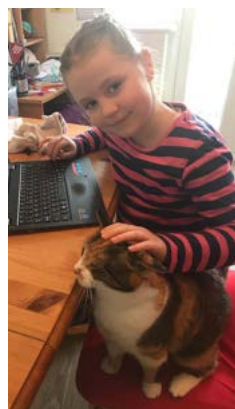
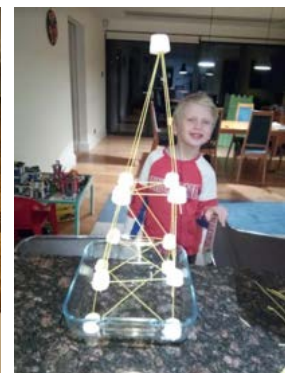
YEAR 2 LEARNING

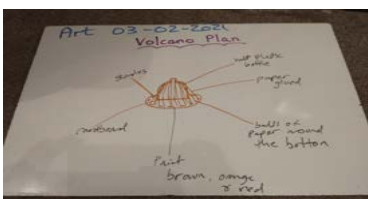

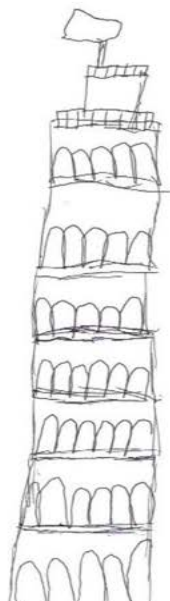
YEAR 4 LEARNING

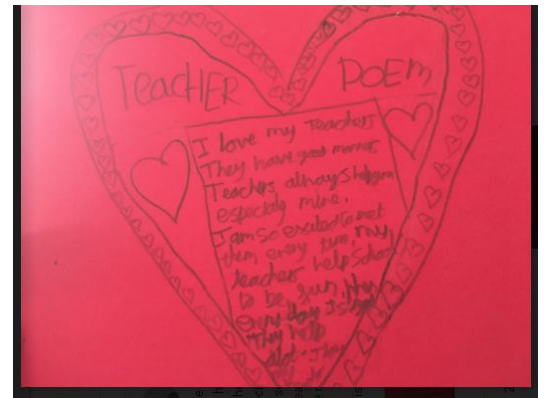
Congratulations, Elsie on creating this stunning cake. I am very impressed with these fabulous baking skills - I am sure you will all agree that it looks absolutely delicious!

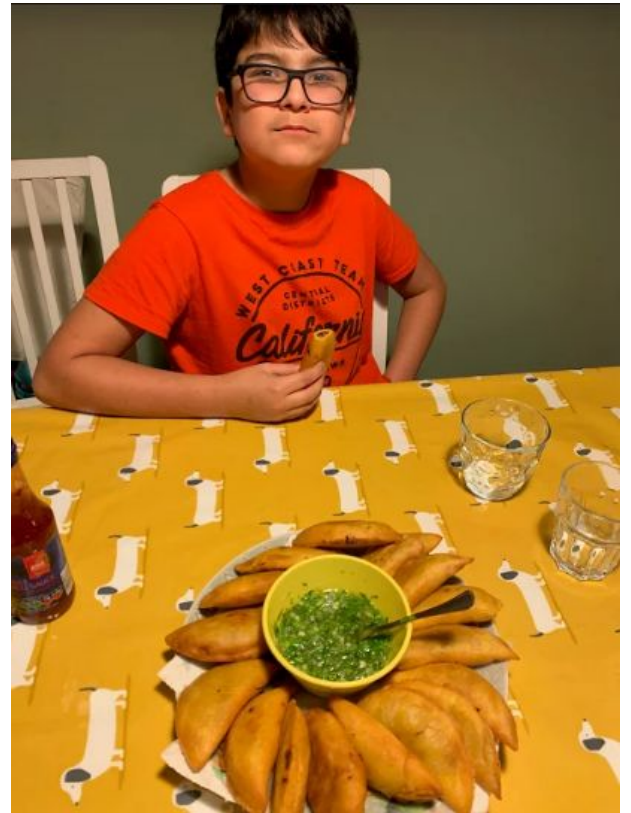
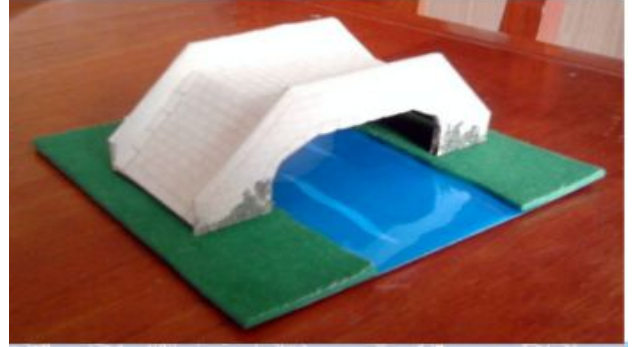


YEAR 6 LEARNING

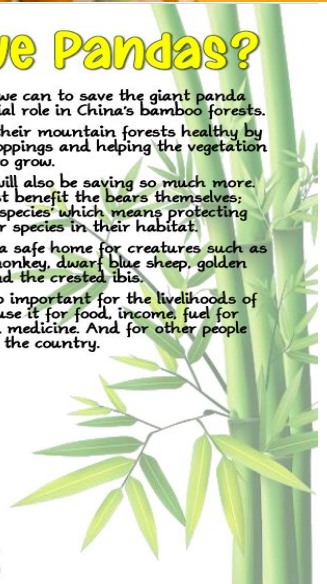
Why Save Pandas?

We should do everything we can to save the giant panda because pandas play a crucial role in China's bamboo forests. Giant pandas help to keep their mountain forests healthy by spreading seeds in their droppings and helping the vegetation to grow.

So, by saving pandas, we will also be saving so much more. Panda reserves don't just benefit the bears themselves; Pandas are an 'umbrella species' which means protecting them protects other species in their habitat.

China's panda reserves are a safe home for creatures such as the golden snub-nosed monkey, dwarf blue sheep, golden pheasant and the crested ibis.

The panda's habitat is also important for the livelihoods of local communities, who use it for food, income, fuel for cooking and heating, and medicine. And for other people across the country.

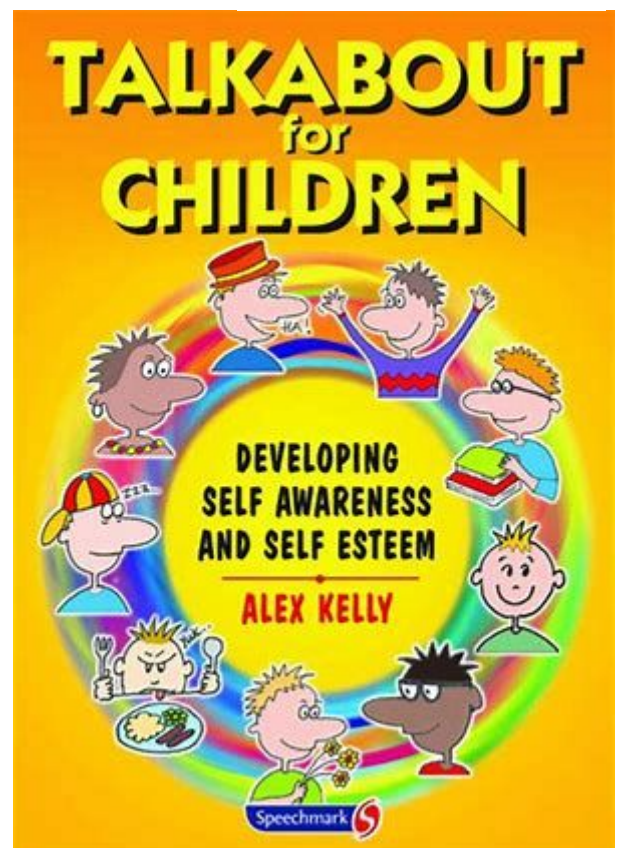


RAINBOW ROOM NEWS
